Founded in 1983 by Dr. Simon and Mrs Elaine Parisier, The Children's Hearing Institute has dedicated itself to helping children with hearing loss and their families. In these two and a half decades, The Institute has pioneered research, education, and therapeutic efforts that have improved the lives of deaf children immeasurably.

Among The Institute's most significant accomplishments is its support of work with cochlear implants. In 1979, Dr. Parisier began his groundbreaking work with this device, which is surgically placed in the cochlea and restores sound to deaf ears. Recognizing that surgical intervention alone would not ensure a child's successful acquisition of the skills needed to develop listening, spoken language, thinking and learning, The Institute was founded to fund and act as a catalyst for a wide variety of research, educational, and clinical services which support and enhance the development and education of deaf and hard of hearing children.
