Controversial Issues in Pediatric Audiology

About the Program:

Topics covered in this course include understanding a cochlear implant map, factors underlying success for children with hearing loss, educational management, highlighting auditory errors, auditory neuropathy, technology for children, medical issues including Usher Syndrome and managing the whole child approach.

- Identify factors that are associated with achieving age-appropriate language and literacy skills in adolescence.
- Select training strategies to resolve specific phonemic confusion.
- Describe music therapy as an effective method in working with children with hearing loss.
